Youth enrolled in poultry, this year there will be no drug withdrawal needed before entering your birds.

Livestock youth this is a reminder you do not have to turn in drug withdrawal forms this year. Those showing sheep and goats if you are putting your sheep or goats on a trailer to be sold you will need to fill a card out at that time saying your animals do not have any drugs in their systems that might harm the meat. Kiss An Animal



Adults can purchase insurance for \$10.00 to protect them from being nominated for this honor if insurance is purchased by the end of the first day of the fair.
