Club leaders will turn them into the office by 5 pm on Friday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2025.

A big thank you to the Reno County Fair Board, Livestock Sale Committee, Superintendents, and volunteers. Most of all, a gigantic thank you to the parents and family who came out to support the kids. Several 4-H'ers will be showing their projects at the state fair, September 5-14, and we hope that you are able to attend and support all of our youth who have made it to the state level.

Several items are due to the Extension Office on October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Record books need to be turned in to your club leaders, who will then turn them into the office. Check with your club leaders to learn when you need to turn them in at your club so that the leaders have time to check over the record books and sign off on them. If you wish to sell an animal at the 2026 county fair, you MUST COMPLETE your record book. Watch for the calendar with the 2025-2026 dates to be shared.

#### ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 2-Bronze 3-Clover 4-Emerald 5-Silver


6-Silver Guard 7-Leadership

8-Gold 9-Gold Guard

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms, and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right-hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB</u>
<u>LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. Club Leaders: Pin Applications are due on Friday, October 3, 2025, by 5 pm. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night: the date & location to be announced at a later date.

## Applying for National Conference and Youth 4-H Youth Leadership Council

The application for and information about the State 4-H Youth
Leadership Council and National Conference is open and available
now! The Youth Council Application and National 4-H Conference
Application will be combined again this year, with applicants
indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities.

Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2026, may apply as a Council Rep, and those 15-18 before January 1, 2026, may apply for the National 4-H Conference.

This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the <u>four</u> <u>extension program areas</u> (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one-year terms on the council. Up to 6 National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview prior to KYLF, and they serve a two-year term on the council.

The deadline will be October 1, 2025.

Every 4-H'er is encouraged to complete a record book and turn it in to their club leader (please do not bring them to the office – your club leader will do that).
