

Citizenship Washington Focus Trip

Road trip across the USA stopping to see Philadelphia, Gettysburg, the Liberty Bell and more! Meet, learn, share and tour with youth from other states and respected resource people. Walk among places that have made history and places that are making news today. Visit Capitol Hill, government departments, historic sites, and memorials. Get a close-up view of the political process through visits to Capitol Hill. Meet with the Kansas Congressional and Senate delegations to discuss legislative issues. Participate in workshops and assembly groups to learn life skills and discuss possible solutions to domestic and international problems. Interact with 4-H members from other states, learning and sharing about 4-H and other interests and issues. This trip has filled up quickly in the last few years, make sure that you do not delay in signing up to attend!

The trip will be in conjunction with Oklahoma and Missouri 4-H from June 13-23, 2026.

Cost: \$2500 - not required when registering, but arrangements will be made after February 16th for payment.

Tips for Giving a Public Presentation:

1. Dress appropriately for the occasion so you feel at ease and look presentable.
2. Stand up fully on both feet. Good posture will help convince your audience that you mean business!
3. Outline your talk, but do not write it out word-for-word. Use your outline as you give your talk (if you need it) but never read your talk!
4. Practice, Practice, Practice giving your talk. Give it to yourself alone at first in front of a mirror. Later, have someone listen to you who will offer suggestions for improving. The more you give it the more comfortable you will be.
5. Speak slowly; talk at a natural speed but change occasionally for emphasis and better attention.
6. Watch pronunciation of words. Don't use words you can't pronounce or understand.
7. Use charts or visuals if they help you present the topic and add to your talk. Make sure the letters on the poster are big enough to be read.
8. Be pleasant. A smile on your face will put a smile in your voice!
9. Be at ease. Be yourself. Be enthusiastic.
10. Have fun sharing the information with your audience! They want to hear what you have to say, are on your side, and want to be supportive of your presentation.

4-H Day Guidelines

Divisions for individual events:

Age Division	Age as of Jan. 1 (years)	Recommended Time Length
Beginners	7-8	3-5 minutes, 7 maximum
Juniors	9-11	3-6 minutes, 7 maximum
Intermediate	12-14	4-7 minutes, 10 maximum
Seniors	15 +	5-10 minutes, 15 maximum

All necessary equipment should be provided by the 4-H'er.

DEMONSTRATIONS

What is a Demonstration?

A demonstration is simply showing and telling how to do something and end with a finished product. It is a teaching method. Most include an introduction, a body, which is the “show and tell” part, and a summary.

- Shows how
- Purpose: to teach
- Visuals: charts & aids for making end product
- Topic may be on any subject of 4-Her's choosing.
- May be individual or team presentation.

ILLUSTRATED TALK

What is an Illustrated Talk?

An illustrated talk is talking and telling how to do something by using pictures, charts, models, equipment, and other types of visual aids.

- Tells how
- Purpose: to teach
- Visuals: models & charts
- Topic may be on any subject of 4-Her's choosing.
- May be individual or team presentation.

PROJECT TALK

What is a Project Talk?

It is a talk about one of your projects. It can tell about your experiences in the project and/or give information relating to your project. The talk should be over something you are familiar with and be of interest to yourself and others.

- Tells about
- Purpose to inform
- Visuals: charts only
- Subject matter: project related
- Topic may be on any 4-H project you are enrolled in.
- Charts are the only visuals accepted
- Seniors: An outline is to be given to the judge.

SPEECH

What is a Speech?

A speech is a talk on any subject that you are familiar with and interested in. The purpose is to inform or persuade the audience on or about your topic.

- Tells about
- Purpose : to inform or persuade
- Visuals: minimal visuals are optional
- Topic may be on any subject of 4-Her's choosing
- Minimal visuals are optional
- Seniors: An outline of the speech is to be given to the judge.

Parliamentary Procedure Contest Guidelines

Age Divisions:

Juniors, 7-11 yrs;
Intermediate, 12-14 yrs;
Seniors, 15 yrs & up.

(Age is determined as of January 1, current year.)

Parliamentary Procedure

Presentations are limited to 15 min, plus a five min. conference judging.

- Contest will consist of teams of four 4-H'ers, President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer within each age group.
- Members may be from more than one club if a club is short one member. (3/4 of the team should be from the same club.)
- Each division needs to follow the business meeting order.
- Use the gavel to:
 - Call to order (2 taps)
 - Dispose of motions (1 tap)
 - Approve minutes (1 tap)
 - Receive treasurer's report (1 tap)
 - Recess/Adjourn (1 tap)
- Juniors and Intermediates will come into the contest already knowing their officer positions.
- Seniors will draw for offices during the presentation prior to the team's presentation.
- The following information sheets are the only notes that can be used during the presentation:
 - General order of business (President only)
 - Secretary's letter of communication and minutes
 - Treasurer's written report of club's financial statement
 - Sheet pertaining to the standing or special committee report (Juniors one each; Intermediate/Seniors only one.)
- Juniors are required and limited to do the first two problems plus one additional problem on the following list
- Intermediates are required to do the first four problems plus two additional problems.
- Seniors are required to do the first six problems plus three additional problems of their choice.

Problems for Presentations

1. Put a motion before the house
2. Amend a motion
3. Lay a motion on the table
4. Call for a division of the house
5. Rise to a point of order
6. Take a motion from the table
7. Withdraw a motion
8. Refer a motion to a committee
9. Call for a division of the question
10. Call for the previous question
11. Reconsider a motion
12. Rescind a motion
13. Appeal the decision of the chair
14. Postpone a motion definitely
15. Postpone a motion indefinitely
16. Reconsider a have entered on the minutes
17. Object to the consideration of the question
