2019 National Youth Science Day Announced



This October, 4-H will launch the 2019 National Youth Science Day (NYSD) challenge, Game Changers. Designed by Google and West Virginia Extension service, Game Changers teaches kids ages 8-14 how to use computer science (CS) to create games, solve problems and engage with topics they're passionate about.

Game Changers uses physical activity and puzzles to teach kids important CS concepts and problem-solving skills, creating real-world connections between computer science and civic engagement, healthy living and agriculture. Although the challenge includes one computer-based and two unplugged activities to help kids learn CS, all can be completed without internet access.

New to NYSD? Game Changers is easier than ever to facilitate and teachers and facilitators don't need any prior experience with computer science or coding to bring the activity to their students.

NYSD kits will go on sale in July - watch for emails from National 4-H and Kansas 4-H regarding sale of kits, as well as events in NYSD events during the month of October.

4-H Horse State Fair Entries

4-H Horses can enter the Kansas State Fairgrounds at 8 a.m. on September 12. No stalls are available until 8 a.m., Thursday, September 12. Check-in begins at 10 a.m.

Required Health Papers

• Current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI/health paper) must have been issued within the past 30 days prior to September 11, 2019.

• A negative Coggins (Equine Infectious Anemia) test is required to have been conducted within one year of the show and must accompany the CVI.

Check-in at Fairgrounds – GATE 10

• Gate 10, located on South Plum is where all horses must enter Fairgrounds.

• Exhibitors will receive a postcard or electronic message before arriving from the Kansas State Fair to get into Gate 10 for unloading.

• Gate personnel will direct exhibitors to the Stall office for further instructions and assignments.

• Pre-ordered Gate Tickets and Hangtags, which are NON-REFUNDABLE will NOT be mailed to the exhibitor(s) home rather picked up at the Credentials office located in the north end of the sheep and swine building.

• Coggins and CVI will be checked at stalls. Stalling office will notify vets for inspection.

Check-in for 4-H Show Table inside EXPO I

• Show check-in table located next to the announcer's stand – Bring horse and 4-H Horse ID(s). Clerks will double check classes, horse(s), and horse identification papers. No adding classes or substituting horses. If showing a two-year old snaffle bit or three-year old have information available (if entered in those classes).

• Exhibitors will receive packet that includes show program, number and t-shirt if pre-ordered.

Show Day

• Check-in with the gate person prior to each class. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to be at the gate and ready for the class.

- Additional show programs available for a fee.
- Exhibitor conflicts must be communicated with the Horse Events

Coordinator or 4-H Horse Superintendents prior to the class

KANSAS 4-H YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The Youth Council Application information link will be available on the KYLF webpage on the State 4-H Website early August. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2020 may apply. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the four Extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW).

Youth Council members work to involve youth with K-State Research and Extension in promoting, developing, implementing and evaluating Kansas Extension 4-H Youth Development programs in order to reflect the needs and interests of the youth in the state. Council members will also plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum, Citizenship in Action, Campference, 48 Hours of 4-H, and other events.

Please encourage those outstanding young leaders in your local unit to apply. Applications are due online October 1, 2019 before 5 p.m. CST and 2 letters of reference must be postmarked or uploaded on the registration site before October 1, 2019 at 5 p.m. The signature page should be postmarked by October 1, 2019. This year the elections will include the application process detailed above, and from those applications up to 12 young people per area will be invited to interview with a panel on Zoom. From those that interview, up to 6 candidates will be selected to be in the election. If you have any questions, please contact Joan.



NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference where youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces.

Delegates must be 15 to 18 years old before January 1, 2020. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected as delegates. Kansas 4-H members who have attended National 4-H Congress are eligible to apply for National 4-H Conference. The 2020 National 4-H Conference will be held March 28-April 2, 2020, at the National 4-H Center in Chevy Chase, Maryland. **Applications are due ONLINE by October 1, 5 p.m. and two letters of reference are to be postmarked by October 1 as well.** Watch the website (see below) for details as the application should be posted early August. For more information about National 4-H Conference and for the application, please go to http://www.kansas4-h.org/events-activities/national-regional-events/national-4-h-conference/index.html. From the state screening process, the top applicants will be invited to Rock Springs for interviews to select final delegates. Final selection of delegates will be made on the basis of the written application and interviews. All interviews will be held during the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum. Nominees must register and attend the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum to interview. If selected as a National 4-H Conference delegate, there are additional responsibilities including being involved in the 4-H program through the State 4-H Youth Council and several other aspects of the Kansas 4-H program.

The approximate share of the registration and transportation costs for delegates chosen to attend this conference is \$1,400.00. There are scholarship possibilities to help offset the cost of the delegate's portion through the Reno County 4-H Council and the Reno County Leadership Fund.

ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30th, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership	6-Silver Guard
2-Bronze	7-Leadership
3-Clover	8-Gold
4-Emerald	9-Gold Guard
5-Silver	

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. Club Leaders: Pin Applications are due on Wednesday, October 2, 2019 by 5 pm. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night on November 2nd.



I encourage each 4-Her to complete a record book and turn it into their club leader (please do not bring them to the office – your club leader will do that). Again this year only record books will be turned in and judged for county medals. Winners of county medals will have the choice of converting their record book into a KAP if they would like to compete at the area level. Forms for record keeping can be found on the Reno County 4-H website.
