ONLINE ENROLLMENT IS OPEN!!!

I would like to encourage all 4-Hers and adults to go to their 4-H Online account and register for the new 4-H year. You will have until November 1 to enroll. We want ALL adults to enroll as either a "Volunteer" or as an "Adult Helper". If you are a direct volunteer (someone that will be working on a continuous basis with the 4-Hers all year such as a project leader), you will enroll as a "Volunteer" and a CBC (criminal background check) will be required. All other adults will enroll as "Adult Helper". Older youth that will be volunteering in 4-H (as a camp counselor, junior leader for a project, etc.) you will enroll as a volunteer but a criminal background check will not be required. Please complete all required sections (the program will not let you proceed if you miss a required question). The enrollment fee will be paid by a sponsor again this year so please click on "paid by a sponsor". DO NOT SEND A CHECK OR PAY WITH A CREDIT CARD. 

ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30th, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 6-Silver Guard2-Bronze 7-Leadership

3-Clover 8-Gold

4-Emerald 9-Gold Guard

5-Silver

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. <u>Club Leaders</u>: Pin Applications are due on Wednesday, October 2, 2019 by 5 pm. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night on November 2nd.



RECORD BOOKS

I encourage each 4-Her to complete a record book and turn it into their club leader (please do not bring them to the office – your club leader will do that). Again this year only record books will be turned in and judged for county medals. Winners of county medals will have the choice of converting their record book into a KAP if they would like to compete at the area level.
